I am extremely worried about the complacent attitudes on display when politicians are being asked what they plan to do to protect coastal communities (like Sandgate) against rising sea-levels and severe weather events.

As a former builder, I am also concerned with the lack of apprenticeships and traineeships available for our youth within our community. It is particularly concerning that – as the "baby boomers" retire — their valuable skills and knowledge are also 'retiring' with them!

As a former workplace trainer and assessor on the Coolum Boardwalk project in 2001, I have witnessed first-hand how partnerships (e.g., between Federal, State and Local Government) can produce good outcomes for long-term unemployed youth, and for the community as a whole.

I value the work in our community of SANDBAG, Sailability, and Keep Sandgate Beautiful Association and I have volunteered with all in the past. I am gravely concerned at the lack of affordable housing and those sleeping rough in the Shorncliffe area. This issue is further exacerbated by recent high rain events and the potential risks to existing homes that have been inundated in the recent past.
